# Day01 KUALA LUMPUR / LONDON

Morning departure to London. Safe arrival at London in the late evening of the same calendar day. Make your own way to hotel for check-in. Noisy, vibrant and truly multicultural, London is a megalopolis of people, ideas and energy. The capital and largest city of both the United Kingdom and of England, it is also the largest city in Western Europe and the European Union. Situated on the River Thames in South-East England, Greater London has an official population of nearly 8 million people — although the figure of over 14 million for the city's total metropolitan area more accurately reflects London's size and importance. London is one of the great "world cities," and remains a global capital of arts, culture, education, fashion, finance, healthcare, tourism, politics and trade. It is the world's largest financial centre alongside New York and has the largest city GDP in Europe. It has the most international visitors of any city in the world. In 2012 London will become the first city to host the Summer Olympic Games three times.



# Day02 SOUTHAMPTON / CRUISE (B)

Early morning after having breakfast at hotel, make your own way to Southampton cruise port for your cruise embarkation at noon. Southampton is located on the south coast of England and just over an hour away from London by car. There are also regular trains from London to Southampton Central. Southampton served as Britain's historic ocean liner gateway for the British Empire and the intense North Atlantic passenger trade to the U.S. and Canada. Today it is the UK's leading cruise port. For most cruise passengers, it's the first and/or last port on a European cruise or Atlantic crossing. A pleasant, bustling city of around a quarter of a million inhabitants, Southampton has several areas of interest, though much of its historic medieval character was destroyed during World War II. Today, it is a modern shopping destination, business center and university town with a large commercial port in addition to its yearround cruise operations. Home to a number of numerous innovative art galleries, such as the City Art Gallery and the Millais Gallery, the

city also has a number of theatres which have hosted West End shows in the past.

#### Day03 CRUISING THE ATLANTIC OCEAN

Prior to the 19th century, transatlantic crossings across the Atlantic Ocean between the Americas and Europe were undertaken in sailing ships, which was a time consuming and often perilous journey. Transatlantic crossings became faster, safer, and more reliable with the advent of steamships. Grand ocean liners began making regularly scheduled crossings, and soon it became a symbol of national and company status to build the largest, fastest, and most luxurious ocean liner for transatlantic crossings. Transatlantic crossings through water are still slow compared to aircraft crossings, taking anywhere between one week and several months to complete.



# Day04 CRUISING THE ATLANTIC OCEAN

QM2 is a transatlantic ocean liner. She was the first major ocean liner built since Queen Elizabeth 2 in 1969, the vessel she succeeded as flagship of the Cunard Line. The ship was named by Queen Elizabeth II in 2004 after the first Queen Mary, completed in 1936. Queen Mary was in turn named after Mary of Teck, consort of King George V. With the retirement of Queen Elizabeth 2 from active duty in 2008, QM2 is currently the only transatlantic ocean liner in operation as a liner, although the ship is often used for cruising, including an annual world cruise. At the time of her construction in 2003 by Chantiers de l'Atlantique, QM2 was the longest, widest and tallest passenger ship ever built, and with her gross tonnage (GT) of 151,400 tons, was also the largest. She no longer holds this distinction after the construction of Royal Caribbean International's 225,282 GT Oasis of the Seas in October 2009. However, QM2 remains the largest ocean liner (as opposed to cruise ship) ever built.

QM2 boasts 14 spacious decks with sweeping staircases and magnificent public rooms - such as the grand Royal Court Theatre or the full beam Britannia Restaurant - furnished in a timeless British style. The ship contains 1,310 cabins including the majestic two-tiered Queen Suites with commanding views over the ship's prow. Guests are catered for impeccably by a total crew of 1,254 people. The ship is essentially a floating city in terms of its size and facilities. Entertainment is easily derived from the QM2's many swimming pools, lounges, shops and gaming tables. Health and relaxation can be obtained from it's fitness centres, steam rooms, massage palours and sports facilities. Even art and education are accounted for with stunning live performances at the Royal Court Theatre and engaging guest speakers with Cunards Insight Programme. In conclusion QM2 offers voyages of unparalleled style and sophistication.

You can expect to find rich furnishings, exquisite traditional décor and premium amenities such as a fluffy bathrobe and slippers in your accommodations aboard QM2. You can receive and send e-mails,
