Day01, 09/06/12(Sat) KUALA LUMPUR / BARCELONA

Early morning departure to Spain's capital Barcelona. Barcelona is Spain's second largest city, with a population of nearly two million people, and the capital of Catalonia. The city has a rich history dating back at least 2,000 years when it gained prominence as a Roman town under its old name, Barcino. When Hans Christian Andersen visited in 1862, he remarked that Barcelona was the "Paris of Spain." The city developed around its Gothic Quarter. Everywhere are archives, libraries, museums and buildings of interest - plus superb examples of modernist and Art Nouveau décor and architecture. Many talented artists, sculptors and architects lived here, including Picasso, Gaudi, Miro and Mares.



Day02, 10/06/12(Sun) BARCELONA / EMBARK CRUISE

Safe arrival at Barcelona in the morning. Upon arrival, explore the city at your own pace or take optional tour to discover Barcelona's attractions. Midday make your own way to the cruise terminal for your embarkation onto the Serenade of the Seas which will sail off in the late afternoon to begin your Mediterranean cruise holiday. Royal Caribbean Serenade of the Seas is the third of four Radiance class cruise ships weighing 90,090 gross tons and accommodating up to 2,501 guests. She is a mid-sized cruise ship with the flexibility and maneuverability to sail into more ports around the globe. Beautifully crafted balustrades and wooden panelling feature on every deck, and with contemporary sculptures and works of art, you can enjoy an atmosphere of calm and relaxation.

Day03, 11/06/12(Mon) **CANNES**, **FRANCE**

Today, your cruise makes its first call at Cannes, a city in southern France, located on the Riviera. Once the site of a small Ligurian port and later a Roman outpost, it wasn't until the 19th century, when aristocrats began to winter in the area's mild climate, that Cannes became popular. In the 1950's, with the beginning of the film festival and a flood of stars, mass tourism transformed this

quiet retreat into today's fashionable resort. Unlike other cities on the French Riviera, Cannes radiates energy. The city is centered on the old port, with a compact central part. Bordered by palm trees and flowers, La Croisette is one of the city's hottest spots and the main promenade running alongside the narrow beach. The old town, Le Suquet, where Gallo-Roman tombs were discovered, provides a medieval feeling and magnificent views of the bay from atop its hill.





Day04, 12/06/12(Tue) LIVORNO (FLORENCE/PISA), ITALY

Livorno, in the Tuscan region of Italy, is today's highlight. Livorno is one of the countries' major naval town and the gateway to Florence and Pisa. Founded by Julius Caesar himself, Florence is known as the birthplace of the Renaissance. History and art shake hands in this picturesque land where masterpieces like Michelangelo's David can be seen in the city's many museums, churches and galleries. Pisa is known for its brilliant ensemble of monuments, which include the 11th-century Cathedral, the Baptistery and the Bell Tower with its pillared galleries. The tower achieved additional fame because of its tilt, having been built on unstable, alluvial land. Galileo, born in Pisa, made use of the tower's inclination in his experiments on the law of gravity. Over the years, a succession of architects have attempted to correct the tilt, which by now measures over 15 feet.

Day05, 13/06/12(Wed) CIVITAVECCHIA (ROME), ITALY

Your cruise calls at Civitavecchia this morning. For centuries the ancient port of Civitavecchia has served as the gateway to magnificent Rome. Rome, as a millenium-long centre of power, culture and religion, having been the centre of one of the globe's greatest civilizations ever, has exerted a huge influence over the world in its c. 2,500 years of existence. With wonderful palaces, millenium-old churches and basilicas, grand romantic ruins, opulent monuments, ornate statues and graceful fountains, Rome has an immensely rich historical heritage and cosmopolitan atmosphere, making it one of Europe's and the world's most visited, famous, influential and beautiful capitals.



Day06, 14/06/12(Thu) NAPLES, ITALY

Arrival at Naples, the diva of Italy today. Naples was founded between the 7th and 6th centuries BC by the Greeks and was named Neapolis, which means new city. It has one of the biggest historical city centre in the world, and its pride are the 448 historical and



monumental churches, the highest number in the World for a single city. Naples is where pasta was invented and where the first pizza was tossed. One of the highlights of the city is the legendary Pompeii, an ancient Roman city covered and preserved by the debris from the violent eruption of Mount Vesuvius in 79 A.D.





Day07, 15/06/12(Fri) AT SEA

See the Basilica St. Mark and St. Mark's Square, the Doges Palace and the Gallerie dell'Accademia which houses some of Italy's finest art treasures, enjoy a romantic ride in a gondola, or visit the nearby island of Murano, where artisans create its world famous glass.



Day10, 18/06/12(Mon) RAVENNA, ITALY

Today your cruise liner continues sailing on the Adriatic Sea towards Ravenna. Located in North-East Italy, Ravenna is a small, quiet town of about 140,000. It looks much like any other Italian city at first glance, with old streets, fine shops and peaceful squares, but the Byzantine domes of its churches still evoke its Eastern heritage. Ravenna was briefly the capital of the Roman Empire and later the Italian capital of the Byzantine Empire. During this time,

incredible mosaics were constructed throughout the city. Described as a symphony of color in Dante's Divine Comedy, Ravenna's well-preserved Byzantine mosaics are some of the finest remaining in the Western world.

<u>Day11, 19/06/12(Tue)</u> **SPLIT, CROATIA**

Over breakfast today you will enjoy the sights of Split as you glide into the Adriatic coast of Croatia. Split is the largest city in Dalmatia in the country of Croatia. It is also one of the oldest cities, traditionally considered just over 1,700 years old. The city was originally built around the Diocletian's Palace, for the retired Roman emperor Diocletian, where the locals sought refuge centuries ago. The palace still stands in the very heart of the old part of Split, which charms visitors with its cobbled streets and Roman architecture. The greater Split area is characterized by its lush vegetation and green areas, particularly Marjan Hill on the west of the peninsula with its ancient indigenous forest. The city makes an ideal base from which to explore the islands, beauty spots, and historic villages in central Dalmatia.

Day12, 20/06/12(Wed) AT SEA

After a couple of busy days visiting some of the Mediterranean's best sights, you will have the chance to just sit back and enjoy the facilities onboard. Treat yourself a seaweed wrap or aroma stone therapy massage at the ShipShape Spa.
