Your introduction to Norway is Stavanger, which occupies a levely setting on the Atlantic Ocean at the entrance to Gandsfjord. Next visit Flaam. Flaam is tucked between high cliffs at the head of the Aurlandsfjord, a banch of the mighty Sogne. Alesund, named after the sound that runs between the islands upon which it is built, is one of Norway's largest fishing ports. You can visit one of the most popular museums in Norway before continue sailing north to the Arctic City of Tromso, the largest city in the Arctic City, and is nicknamed both 'Paris of the North' and the 'Gateway to the Arctic'. On to Honningsvag for the opportunity, weather permitting, to view the Midnight Sun at the North Cape. Towards the south, visit Trondheim, Norway's first capital and this cosmopolitan city boasts wide streets lined with brightly coloured houses and global warehouse. Next, your cruise calls at Andalsnes. It is the gateway to some magnificent Norwegian scenery including the Trollstigen, one of the Europe's most amazing roads with its many hairpin bends. Now explore Olden, a picturesque village situated at the mouth of the Oldeelva River along the Nordfjord. Your last call is the old Hanseatic port of Bergen with its medieval buildings, cobbled streets, colourful markets, restaurants and gift shops. After a final day at sea, you sail back into Southampton with memories to treasure. The Queen Victoria carrying 2,014 passengers onboard at 90,000 GT has been described as 'a sonnet in motion' - she is designed to be the stuff of legends. With contemporary sophistication mixed with timeless antiques, the elegance of her décor will take you back to a more sophisticated era. Traveling through the Norwegian coast, this ship will immerse you in amazing cultures, as well as luxury. She exudes elegance with marbles, woods, plush carpets, warm and comfortable beds, and exceptional service will ensure that your trip is amazing.





<u>Day01 21/05/2012 (Mon)</u> **KUALA LUMPUR / LONDON** Late evening flight departure to London.

<u>Day2 22/05/2012 (Tue)</u> LONDON / SOUTHAMPTON / EMBARK QUEEN VICTORIA

Early morning safe arrival at London. You will then be transferred to Southampton cruise port for your cruise embarkation. Queen Victoria sets sail from Southampton this late afternoon and heads north. You will have plenty of time to settle in to your cabin, enjoy a delicious meal onboard and a relaxing evening as you look forward to the experiences that await along the Norwegian coast.

Distinguished by her red and black livery, Queen Victoria was built in the January 2007, and was named by the Queen of Great Britain - Queen Elizabeth 2 on 10 December 2007. Measuring nearly 300m in length, Queen Victoria is Cunard's second largest cruise liner with a maximum passenger capacity of 2,014 over 12 decks. She is outfitted as a cruise ship, with the décor of a classic liner. From her double- and triple-height spaces—design features of grand liners of the past—to rooms imbued with an elegant yet understated British charm, the overall effect is contemporary and historically classic. Queen Victoria offers all the classic characteristics that have become associated with the company's unique liner heritage. From the outside, her distinctive black and red livery will hint at the experience that differentiates a Cunard liner from a modern-day cruise ship. This will be most evident in the ship's homage to the liner traditions of the past with elegant public rooms, many on a grand scale, and all graciously-styled with luxurious finishings. The public spaces will set the stage for myriad programs and amenities that also distinguish Cunard's liner persona as guests enjoy entertainment and enrichment options that evoke a more civilized era of travel.



Day03 23/05/2012 (Wed) CRUSING THE NORTH SEA

Settle in to your luxurious new surroundings and enjoy the comforts of your cruise as you cross the North Sea bound for Norway. Norway, is a Nordic country in Northern Europe occupying the western portion of the Scandinavian Peninsula. It stretches from the

North Sea near Denmark and Scotland into the Arctic Ocean where it borders northern Finland and the northwestern tip of Russia. Norway is one of Europe's most sparsely populated countries. With a population of only 4.9 million people and a land area of 385,802 km², the population density is only 16 inhabitants per km². Most of the populations are Norwegians. The indigenous Sami people traditionally inhabit the northern part of Norway, that along with parts of Sweden, Finland and Russia outlines an area known as Sapmi (or Sameland). Norway is well known for its amazing and varied scenery. The fjords in the west of the country are long narrow inlets, flanked on either side by tall mountains where the sea penetrates far inland. The vast majority of the land is a rocky wilderness, and thus Norway has large, completely unpopulated areas, many of which have been converted to national parks. A rugged landscape shaped by the Ice Age, shows forested hills and valleys, mountains, waterfalls, and a long coastline with fjords, islands, and mountains growing directly up from the sea.

Day04 24/05/2012 (Thu) STAVANGER, NORWAY

Today, your cruise arrives at the first port of call, Stavanger. Having 115,000 people, Stavanger is Norway's fourth-largest city and a fascinating mix of old and new. Its history stretches back deep into the Middle Ages. Stavanger was once a tranquil coastal market town and then later an important fishing port. A great tourist attraction here is Prekestolen, which is also known as, The Pulpit Rock. This is a very colossal rock that overhangs the fjord and is wedged in the cliff 1000m above the fjords. Domkirke Cathedral is a church that was built in the middle ages around 1125. A fire nearly destroyed the structure, however it was spared. Upon new construction, two square towers and a massive porch were added. The gothic architecture makes this cathedral a must see for the tourists.



Day05 25/05/2012 (Fri) FLAAM, NORWAY

Continuing north, a small town located in Aurland called Flaam is today's highlight. Tourism is the most important industry here, with almost 450,000 visitors a year. Most people come to either ride Rallarvegen from Finse or to enjoy a spectacular 12 mile ride of Flåmsdalen with Flåmsbana. If you enjoy walking or hiking, Aurlandsdalen is a great place to start. Have a great time walking through the valley of lush greenery and coming across a beautiful waterfall. Sognefjorden is the deepest and longest fjord in the world. Surrounding this fjord are beautiful mountains, valleys, and waterfalls. A very beautiful area and a picture opportunity location.

<u>Day06 26/05/2012 (Sat)</u> **ALESUND, NORWAY**

Today your cruise will call at Alesund early in the morning. On the night of January 23, 1904, the city was the scene of the Alesund Fire, one of the most extreme of the many infernos to which Norwegian towns, once built mostly of wood, have been subjected to. Virtually the whole town was destroyed, a windstorm helping



the flames, and the population had to leave the place in the middle of the night with only a few minutes' notice. Alesund is a port of call for passenger and freight vessels traveling between Bergen, Kingston upon Hull, Newcastle, Hamburg, and Trondheim. Alesund is also the site of a yearly Norwegian Food Festival.



Day07 27/05/2012 (Sun) CRUISING THE NORWEGIAN SEA

Spend the day at Norwegian Sea as your cruise makes its way north along the stunning Norwegian coast. Your dining experience on the Queen Victoria will be one to remember. The Queens Grill, the Princess Grill, and the Britannia Restaurant are all great spots where seating is determined by your stateroom or suite; your meals are served in gracious and formal settings, and you have your own waiter to cater to your needs. Alternate dining options include some great venues. The Todd English Restaurant draws inspiration from Mediterranean cuisines, while the Lido offers a more casual ambience for a relaxed meal. The Golden Lion serves pub food as well as beer and cider, while the Courtyard is an exclusively reserved area with outdoor seating for a more enjoyable meal experience.

<u>Day08 28/05/2012 (Mon)</u> **TROMSO, NORWAY**

Awake on day 8 in the knowledge that you have crossed the Arctic Circle and precedes your arrival at Tromso. Otherwise known as the 'Gateway to the Arctic' or 'Paris of the North', Tromso is almost 350km north of the Arctic Circle. The starting point for early 19th Century trapping expeditions, today's Tromso is known for its fishing and as a town that blends old and new in an attractive mix for the visitor. Here you find art, history, sophistication, good food and an infamous nightlife in a bustling, tiny city. All of it, though, is surrounded by spectacular scenery that is visible from everywhere in town. The city is home to the world's northernmost university, as well as research institutes and satellite based industry. The population is therefore highly skilled, but retains the straightforwardness and sense of humour that the North is known for.

Day09 29/05/2012 (Tue) HONNINGSVAG, NORWAY

Today, your cruise sails even further north and dock in the town of Honningsvag. Honningsvag claims to be the northernmost city in Norway and even in the world. But legislation effective from 1997 states that a Norwegian city must have 5,000 inhabitants. Honningsvag with an estimated population of 2,500 doesn't meet that requirement. People have lived in this area as far back as 10,000 years ago. The sea was the main food supplier for this prehistoric settlement. Indeed, the ice free ocean provides fisheries even today, and tourism is also vital. And due to the temperate sea water, winter temperatures in Honningsvag are much milder than one would expect at this latitude. Honningsvag is the doorway to the wonders of the spectacular North Cape. Travelers who stand on the cliff at the North Cape are extremely close to the North Pole. The clouds and light of the Midnight Sun are known to be brilliant at this location at the end of the earth. The Midnight Sun is exactly what it sounds like at midnight you can actually see the sun. This

phenomenon can be seen in the area from the middle of May until the end of July.

Day10 30/05/2012 (Wed) CRUISING THE NORWEGIAN SEA

Returning southward from Honningsvag, the ship continues sailing on the Norwegian Sea recrosses the Arctic Circle. After a couple of busy days visiting some of Norway's best sights, you will have the chance to just sit back and enjoy the facilities onboard. The Queen Victoria has so many diversions and distractions, you will be pleasantly and thoroughly entertained both day and night. Pamper yourself, work up a sweat, or enjoy an enriching seminar. The ship has the Cunard Royal Spa and Fitness Centre, where you can enjoy a distinctive spa program that includes ocean views, relaxation areas, treatment rooms, therapies, and more. You can relax by the two swimming pools, or enjoy one of the four whirlpools. There is a library with thousands of titles, a retail outlet featuring designer stores as well as jewelry and souvenirs, and plenty of places to relax. There are ballroom dancing lessons, computer lessons, a unique maritime museum display and an Internet Centre. Afternoon tea is served in the Queens Room, and there is a sports deck with basketball, shuffleboard, and more.



Day11 31/05/2012 (Thu) TRONDHEIM, NORWAY

Arrival at Trondheim harbour in the morning and you will have a full day to explore the old town which features broad streets, narrow alleys and beautiful low, wooden buildings. This attractive city was Norway's first capital, between 997 and 1380, it was here that the new kinds of old Norway received that ceremonial blessing. The city's old heritage can still be traced in and around the city centre. The marvellous Nidaros Cathedral, the largest church of Northern Europe, towers over the city centre, which is roughly the area inside the serpentining Nidelva river. Even if the size is modest, there's a lot going on in Trondheim. Music, arts, culture, alternative politics, nightlife, student life...all combines into making Trondheim one of the most exciting city centres of Northern Europe. The city celebrated its 1000th anniversary in 1997.



<u>Day12 01/06/2012 (Fri)</u> **ANDALSNES, NORWAY**

Today, on our return voyage to the UK your cruise calls at Andalsnes, a small town in the metropolis of Rauma, of which it is also the executive center. Andalsnes has and estimated population of 3,500 inhabitants, and is located at the mouth of the river Rauma, which flows through the valley Romsdal. After the German World



War II assault of Norway in April, 1940, British troops landed in Andalsnes as a part of a pincer movement to take mid-Norwegian city Trondheim. The northern arm of the attack was established in Namsos. Lacking control of the air, the forces at Andalsnes were withdrawn in early May, 1940.

Day13 02/06/2012 (Sat) **OLDEN / NORDFJORD**

Today you will sail into the Nordfjord, the sixth-longest fjord in Norway. Its 65 miles encompass the rough coastline of Stadhavet, as well as the glacier Jostedalsbreen, Europe's largest mainland glacier. You will enter the Utfjord and the Innviksfjord to reach Olden. Olden was founded in the 18th-century and has two churches. The one in the village was built in 1759 on the site of a stave church dating from around 1300. The new church, a short distance along the valley, was built in 1934.

Day14 03/06/2012 (Sun) BERGEN, NORWAY

We arrive in Norway's second largest city, Bergen today. With its spectacular setting among seven hills, the city is renowned for its beautiful nature. Founded in 1070 A.D. by the illustrious King Olav Kyrre, it was the headquarters for the Hanseatic League, an association of merchants in northern Europe until the 17th century. Although the city periodically has been ravaged by fire, many fine examples of medieval and Renaissance architecture can still be found. Bergen's association with the sea has given the city its lifeblood. The fishing industry has provided the economic backbone for the region for centuries. Another important source of income is tourism. The main event of the season is the Bergen International Festival. This festival of music, drama, folklore, opera and ballet coincides with Fjord Blossom Time, the period when Norway's fjord country is radiant with the colors of spring.

Day15 04/06/2012 (Mon) CRUISING THE NORTH SEA

Your cruise liner will once again cruise over the North Sea heading for the UK, and your final opportunity to make the most of the onboard entertainment. The entertainment on the Queen Victoria guarantees to dazzle. Grand and elegant public rooms are filled with entertainers, acts, and cocktails. The Royal Court Theatre provides a three-level venue to enjoy grand productions of musicals, as well as live music; it even has private boxes. The Midships Lounge is for the wine connoisseur - explore regional wines and taste your favorites. The Golden Lion is an English pub with classic English flair - darts, karaoke, ales, ciders and a full pub menu. The Chart Room is a nautically themed lounge and bar, great for a pre-dinner cocktail. Try your luck at the Empire Casino, with roulette, blackjack, and more of your favorite casino games. Hemispheres is a nightclub with a glass-domed roof, live bands, and amazing music.



Day16 05/06/2012 (Tue) **SOUTHAMPTON / LONDON**

Leisurely have your breakfast while your cruise returns to Southampton this morning. Disembark and make your own way back to London. The rest of the day is free at leisure. Noisy, vibrant and truly multicultural, London is a megalopolis of people, ideas and energy. The capital and largest city of both the United Kingdom and of England, it is also the largest city in Western Europe and the European Union. Situated on the River Thames in South-East England, Greater London has an official population of nearly 8 million people — although the figure of over 14 million for the city's total metropolitan area more accurately reflects London's size and importance. London is one of the great "world cities," and remains a global capital of arts, culture, education, fashion, finance, healthcare, tourism, politics and trade. It is the world's largest financial centre alongside New York and has the most international visitors of any city in the world.



<u>Day17 06/06/2012 (Wed)</u> **LONDON (B)**

Breakfast at hotel. Full day at leisure to enjoy any optional tour or just explore this awe-inspiring city on your own pace. London contains four World Heritage Sites: the Tower of London; Kew Gardens; the site comprising the Palace of Westminster, Westminster Abbey and St. Margaret's Church; and the historic settlement of Greenwich (in which the Royal Observatory marks the Greenwich Meridian (0° longitude) and GMT). Other famous landmarks include Buckingham Palace, the London Eye, Piccadilly Circus, 30 St Mary Axe ("The Gherkin"), St Paul's Cathedral, Tower Bridge and Trafalgar Square. London is home to numerous museums, galleries, libraries, sporting events and other cultural institutions including the British Museum, National Gallery, British Library, Wimbledon and 40 theatres.
